Couples looking for some indulgence can splash out on the Ocean Front Penthouse, which boasts a huge tub, its own gym and a heated massage bed. The wellness offering is equally as impressive here, with daily complimentary spa treatments to reward clients for all that exercise.

The hotels offer a healthy approach to eating, with choices including local vegetarian, vegan and low-carb options, and when clients are ready to burn off some calories, there's the Bluefit Park, complete with special outdoor training facilities to enhance strength and endurance.

Bluefit guides can set out a bespoke training plan for clients, including nutritional tips, yoga and meditation classes, and a workout schedule.

MOUNTAIN HIGHS

Pause: Who said mountain holidays were just for skiers? During summer in the Austrian Tyrol, the climate is warm, the mountain air crisp, and clients can potter through charming villages, stopping to refuel on coffee and delicious slices of cake along the way. 66

The surrounding fields and forests make for excellent walking opportunities. Or if that sounds too much like hard work, the hotel is equipped with indoor and outdoor pools, a spa centre with a sauna, steam room and Ayurvedic treatments, and weekly live music in the evenings. Inghams offers a week's all-inclusive stay at the Hotel Bon Alpina from £734 including flights.

Play: If clients are seeking more of an adrenaline rush in the powder, suggest Neilson's Hotel Del Clos in Andorra's El Tarter, which boasts a large sun terrace looking out over the mountains and is perfectly located for those who like to be first on the slopes each morning. To keep little ones happy, there are four children's clubs, plus a games room and a snow garden. The resort also offers a ski school pick-up and dropoff service and evening childcare.

After a hard day playing about in fresh snow, the adults can head to the wellness area, which offers a range of treatments including sports massages and Indian head massages, or sip sundowners in the après-ski bar.

The hotel is part of Neilson's Mountain Collection, which allows guests free guiding and coaching services from skilled ski and snowboard instructors, and also gives them a queue jump to maximise their time on the mountain. Prices start from £435 per adult based on two sharing for seven nights from January 8, 2017.
