# Skiing on ashgestring

Families can hit the slopes on Christmas Day for less than you might expect – all that agents need is a little creativity, finds Alice Barnes-Brown

> he cold of the mountains may bite, but the cost-of-living crisis doesn't have to. A Club Med survey revealed in October that skiers were spending an average of £1,580 per person on their ski holidays this winter – down £399 from the previous year. Skiers may be more cautious with their spending,

The Christmas holidays are a superb time to go skiing – school's out, the snow is reliable, and the air is full of festive cheer – but it can be costlier than in term-time. However, it is possible to find week-long trips over Christmas costing less than £2,750 for a family of four; it just requires thinking outside the box...

but they're still keen to get some snow-based action.

#### **BUDGET FOR BULGARIA**

#### Best for: Seasoned skiers

Bulgaria's top ski resort, Bansko, sits at the foot of the Pirin Mountains, which are transformed into a snow-covered wonderland every winter, with 75km of marked pistes. A 20-minute gondola ride takes clients from the heart of town, over the cone-shaped hills to the ski area, where both a blue and black run can take skiers of varying abilities straight back down. Snow machines located across the slopes guarantee full coverage, even in warmer months.

After a day on the slopes, evenings in Bansko are refreshingly relaxed: families can visit a stone-built mehana for taverna-style hospitality and wallet-friendly good food (three-course meals in restaurants like these average around £15), plus there's a bowling centre open until 11 pm. **Book it:** Balkan Holidays offers seven nights' self-catering in the three-star Apartments Winslow Elegance (which has a kids' playground), departing on December 23, from £1,854 for a family of four sharing. This includes flights from Gatwick, luggage and return transfers. balkanholidays.co.uk >>

#### FABULOUS FRANCE

#### Best for: Year-round snow

High-altitude Les Deux Alpes boasts Europe's longest glacier for skiing, with smooth, gently sloping runs perfect for smaller skis. Plus, if clients can't make it out for the Christmas holidays, the glacier is ski-able year-round.

At the ski area's summit, there's a revamped ice cave containing ethereal animal sculptures, a family-friendly restaurant with views across to Mont Blanc, and an incredible viewpoint that appears to hang over a steep drop into the impenetrable Alps. Ski passes here are flexible, with half-day options available. Add extra value by telling clients they can save up to €80 by buying a week's ski pass for the whole family.

**Book it:** Skiworld offers seven nights' self catering at Multi Residences 1650 for £2,138 for a family of four, including transfers and flights from Heathrow on December 23. *skiworld.co.uk* 

#### DIME-SAVING DINARICS

#### Best for: Beginners

Above the clouds in the Dinaric Alps is Bjelašnica, Bosnia and Herzegovina's highest ski area. The area rose to prominence in 1984 when it hosted the men's Alpine skiing at the Winter Olympics. An extensive redevelopment of the ski centre in 2017 has turned Bjelašnica into a thoroughly modern ski resort, ideal for total beginners with its expansive nursery slopes.

It's also easily accessible, at just an hour's drive from the nearest airport, Sarajevo. There are a handful

of hotels, including wellness-oriented Hotel Monti at the end of the sledging slope – the hotel's Six Sense Spa has a lengthy treatment menu and warming infrared cabin, perfect for soothing tired muscles. **Book it:** Crystal Ski offers seven nights' half board at Hotel Monti from £556 per person, based on four sharing, including flights from Gatwick on December 24, plus transfers and luggage. crystalski.co.uk

#### CASH-CONSCIOUS ITALY

#### Best for: Foodie families

Cervinia, in Italy's scenic Aosta Valley, is home to one of Europe's best-value ski resorts. There are 30 blue pistes, well suited to beginner and intermediate parents and kids, with the option to ski down either back into the Italian resort or postcard-perfect Zermatt (across the border in Switzerland). A revolutionary new cableway connecting the two resorts opened in May, and at points dangles one mile over a glacier. If the pistes doesn't appeal, Cervinia also has a cool snowpark where older kids and teens can showcase their freestyle moves on the ramps.

For afters, clients can wander a traffic-free main street lined with pubs and shops, enjoy delicious Italian pastas and wood-fired pizzas and try out the ice-karting course. **Book it:** Inghams has a seven-night self-catering package at the Base Camp Apartments, including flights and transfers departing on December 24, for £666 per person, based on a family of four sharing. *inghams.co.uk*
