t's the start of summer, the flowers are in full bloom, and up and down the UK, people are dusting off their hats, posh frocks and three-piece suits, because wedding season is well under way.

Nearly two thirds of weddings take place between May and September, according to the Office for National Statistics, with four in 10 during the peak months of June, July and August. And while some couples might hold off their honeymoon for a few weeks or even months, most still want to jet off within a few days of their big date – if only to unwind after the worry of wedding planning.

That means you need to have a few ideas up your sleeve for the best places to go on a summer honeymoon. There's no point sending them to Vietnam in the middle of monsoon season, or to the South Island of New Zealand at the height of the southern hemisphere's winter. But get it right, and you'll keep the happy couple's wedding day buzz going all the way through the honeymoon.

### THE FLY-AND-FLOPPERS

After all that wedding stress - the flurry of fittings, photographers and family drama that seems to come with any set of nuptials - couples could be forgiven for wanting to flop down on a beach and not move for a fortnight.

They aren't short on options, but why not look for somewhere that will spoil them with a dedicated honeymoon package and help their wedding budget stretch that bit further too?

Or try: The Maldives is a honeymoon favourite, and while there's plenty to do if you've got energy to burn - snorkel with manta rays, dive on the house reef, or try one of myriad water sports - most guests content themselves with kicking back on their overwater sun deck or taking a stroll along a whitesand shore. New stargazing sessions at Anantara Kihavah Maldives Villas, home to an overwater observatory and a 'sky guru' to explain what you're seeing, are a good selling point for romantic types.



It's probably not going to be the couple's first time away together, but it should definitely be the most memorable, so why not put that honeymoon budget to good use and help them go further or do more than they've ever done on holiday before?

Alison Holman, Africa product manager at Cox & Kings, says: "Book early for Kenya's great migration in August and September 2019, as it's the the wildebeest cross the Mara River, you will see dramatic scenes as crocodiles eagerly await their prey. After a safari, a popular choice is to add a beach extension, whether that's in Kenya, the Seychelles or Zanzibar, depending on which one best suits the budget." Book it: Cox & Kings offers a nine-night private trip to see the great migration in Kenya, with four nights at Rekero Camp in the Masai Mara and five nights at Alfajiri Villas on the Kenyan coast. Prices start at £7,440 per person based on two sharing, including flights, transfers, all meals, game drives, park fees and local drinks.

Or try: Our summer is the southern hemisphere's winter, so unless clients are looking for chillier climes, it's best to stay near the equator, where temperatures are hot year-round. It never gets cold in Queensland, so die-hard divers can fulfil that lifelong ambition to dive on the Great Barrier Reef. Or send adventure-hungry honeymooners to Peru, where the Belmond Hiram Bingham train to Machu Picchu or the new Belmond Andean Explorer, which travels along one of the world's highest rail routes. are good focal points to build an itinerary around.


## THE COUPLE WITH KIDS
