The Zen Spa is the Hyatt Zilara's crowning glory, with a modern hydrotherapy circuit, 11 treatment rooms and a relaxation lounge with an outdoor terrace where guests enjoy yoga. As well as traditional treatments, a new Alchemy Workshop invites guests to try their hand at creating all-natural products. I start by grinding down coffee beans and almond flakes as a base for my body scrub, add skin-nourishing honey and then choose the scent from a selection of essential oils. I opt for orange and bergamot, and when I try it out in the shower, my skin feels gloriously soft.

Clients seeking even more relaxation can set up camp in a private cabana on the beach, to which attentive waiters will bring drinks and snacks, so you won't have to lift a finger.
