The Art Bakery

Taking a fika (coffee and cake break) is a must for locals, so be sure to join them at the Art Bakery in the NK shopping centre. Here, celebrity baker Johan Sörberg blends art with baking via handcrafted creations, interior design and internal exhibitions. For something different, vegetarian restaurant Rutabaga in the Grand Hotel is still a hot favourite, with two taster menus among its fare. artbakery.se

Gamla Stan

A visit to Stockholm isn't complete without a wander through the city's old town, known as Gamla Stan, which dates back to 1252. It's home to the expansive and impressive buildings that make up the Royal Palace. Alternatively, a rooftop tour is an excellent way to get the best views: Takvandring will take you on an historical walk 43m above the ground.

Stockholm City Museum
